#### Dear Expectant Mother,

We are pleased that you have selected Baptist Women's Hospital for the birth of your child. We offer several ways for you to pre-register with us for your visit.

- You can pre-register online at the following website: http://www.baptistonline.org/facilities/preregister.asp
- · You can choose to fill out the form that is provided by our facility and mail it back to us at no cost.
- You can come by our facility and pre-register in person at your convenience Monday through Friday from 5 a.m. - 4:30 p.m.
- You can also call to pre-register at 901-227-9120 at your convenience Monday through Friday from 5 a.m. - 4:30 p.m.

Once we have your information, we will send you a letter stating that we have received your information.

#### A few reminders:

- Please read and review the sheet from our admissions department.
- Sign up for any childbirth classes by your 5th or 6th month so you will have a better choice of dates and be able to complete the classes a few weeks prior to your due date.
- Remember to choose a pediatrician for your baby-call their office, make sure they are accepting new patients and that they accept your insurance plan.

We will call your insurance company to verify your insurance eligibility and benefits in regards to your upcoming visit. If you are unsure what your insurance requires, please contact them to get this information. If there are any upfront financial obligations, our financial counselor will contact you with that information to work out some sort of arrangement with you prior to your visit. The hospital requires that all patients pay any deductible, co-pay, or co-insurance amount that their insurance company requires prior to being discharged from the facility.

If you would like to pre-pay a deductible, co-pay, or co-insurance amount, please contact us by phone or come by the admissions department prior to your delivery. If you have any financial questions, please call our financial counselor at 901-227-9124.

### VISITATION GUIDELINES FOR LABOR & DELIVERY

In order to provide our laboring moms with the best care possible and to protect the privacy of all patients, we respectfully request that you and your family observe the following guidelines:

**Triage Area**—This is the area where we first assess mom and notify her physician - then transfer and get her set up in a birthing room. Please only one support person in this area.

Birthing Room—A "total" of three visitors in the room at any one time - including primary support person - others need to "swap out."

Labor & Delivery Hallways—In order to protect the privacy of our patients, family members and visitors will need to go to the waiting room if asked to leave the room - the hallways must remain clear.

For Delivery-With the permission of the physician, you may have up to two people present if you choose.

**After Delivery**—Baby and mom need private time to bond and breastfeed. Family members and visitors will be allowed back to visit after delivery if mom is feeling up to it once she has had "her time" with baby.

#### Visitation Guidelines for the Mother/Baby Unit

To provide rest and promote bonding for the new baby, we ask that you observe the following guidelines:

**Visiting Hours**—Family members and friends are welcome to visit our mother/baby unit from 7 a.m. to 9 p.m. if mom is feeling up to having visitors. One person may stay overnight in mom's room.

Sibling Visits—New brothers and sisters are welcome; however another adult besides mom needs to be present and responsible for their care during the visit. A "goody bag" packed with toys, videos, and snacks may be helpful for younger siblings who may become bored during visit time.

#### Other times for you to remember:

Wi-Fi Zones: Our free wireless network is available in the hospital and the Women's Health Center. Information is available from the nurses' stations.

Gift Shop Hours: Monday- Thursday 9 am-6 pm; Friday 9 am-5 pm; Saturday 12 pm-3 pm

Cafeteria Location: Located on the first floor of hospital

IMPORTANT: All visitors should be free from any contagious illness, fever, etc. to protect the new baby. If there is any doubt about a possible illness, it is always better to wait and visit at another time. EVERYONE needs to wash his or her hands before and after handling the new baby. Thank you for your cooperation.

## CHILDBIRTH AND FAMILY EDUCATION CLASSES/SUPPORT GROUPS

#### Beautiful Bundles (new mom support group)

Facilitated by registered nurses with backgrounds in mother-baby care, this free support group provides accurate and reliable information on sleeping issues, breastfeeding, safety and caring for your newborn or infant. Moms also have the opportunity to bond with other new moms, share experiences and gain reassurance.

#### **Breastfeeding Class**

This single-session, two-hour class teaches expectant moms the basics of how to breastfeed successfully, as well as discussing the advantages of breastfeeding. Information on going back to work and pumping is also included in this class.

#### **Expectant Parents Class**

Learn all the baby basics in this three-hour class, including infant care, infant safety, infant CPR and surviving the first few weeks.

#### **Grandparents Class**

An update on childbirth and parenting practices, this two-hour class gives grandparents tips for helping new parents and providing infant care.

#### Lamaze Refresher Class

Designed for couples who have previously attended childbirth classes and are planning a natural delivery, this is a great opportunity to review the labor process and breathing and relaxation techniques.

#### Sibling Class

Perfect for 3- to 10-year-olds, this class helps prepare children for the arrival of their new brother or sister. This two-hour interactive session benefits parents, too, providing suggestions to help them make the transition easier.

#### One-day Childbirth Class (Saturday)

An alternative to the traditional prepared childbirth course, this class is an excellent option for those who can't attend weeknight sessions or have busy schedules. This one-day session covers the same information provided in the traditional classes, along with a tour of the labor and delivery unit.

#### My Baby Expectations

Sign up for month-by-month information about the changes you'll experience during your pregnancy—emailed right to your inbox. My Baby Expectations is a free monthly e-newsletter from Baptist Memorial Health Care that will give you tips and guidelines on what to expect, all the way through your new baby's first year.

#### Prepared Childbirth Class

This four-week series addresses the basics of childbirth – labor, pain management options and basic breathing and relaxation techniques – as well as offering a tour of the labor and delivery area. At the end of the series, attendees may elect to take an additional class that teaches advanced breathing techniques, massage therapy and comfort measures for those planning to have a natural delivery.

#### SuperSitters Class

Enroll your preteen or teen in this all-day session, which provides information on being a responsible baby-sitter, basic first aid, appropriate play and discipline techniques, and safety instruction.

A WORD OF WELCOME – Even before your arrival at Baptist Memorial Hospital for Women, our staff is making preparations to meet your specific needs. To speed you admission, we ask that you complete and return the attached pre-admission form.

WHEN YOU ARRIVE at the hospital, come directly to the Main entrance located on the Humphreys Blvd. side of Baptist Memorial Hospital for Women. Report directly to Labor & Delivery by taking the elevator, located just off of the lobby, to the second floor.

INSURANCE – Although you will be personally responsible for your bill, the hospital will file a claim with your insurance carrier. Your health care insurance is a private contract between you and your insurance carrier, but we will file your claim and assist you in every way possible. To expedite the verification of your insurance, please enclose a copy of the front and back of your insurance card.

A deposit is required upon admission, if no health care insurance is available or if your insurance is not sufficient to cover expenses. You will be notified by admissions personnel should a deposit be necessary for your hospital stay. If you have questions, please dial (901) 227-9124 or (901) 227-9120.

The balance of your hospital charges above your deposit or confirmed insurance coverage is payable upon your discharge from the hospital.

VALUABLES - It is recommended that valuables not be brought to the hospital. In the event it is necessary for you to bring such items, we cannot assume responsibility for them unless they are deposited with the security department.

VISITING HOURS - Our Maternity Unit visiting hours are listed in detail in our Welcome to the Maternity Department brochure. You should receive a copy of this brochure upon arriving at your room after delivery.
